What is the Great Debate?

NHI leadership programs at the high school freshman level concentrate on strengthening student communications skills, guiding them to speak with authority, skill, and confidence. Teams of 25-40 are organized in local communities and train with volunteers from March to May. NHI annually sets debate themes and topics. Students can decide to compete in stand-alone events like Oratory and Extemporaneous Speaking or team competitions like Cross Examination Debate and Mock Trial.

Where does the Great Debate take place?

Teams travel by chartered bus in June or July to the various tournament sites, which include Austin College in North Texas, Augustana College in Southern Illinois, or the University of Texas at Austin. Students from the Northeast U.S., different Latin American countries, or those with schedules that do not allow for extra activity in the Spring can attend the six-day format, which does not require prior preparation. NHI offers six-day tournament sites at the nationally recognized campus of Villanova University in Pennsylvania or the newly established Texas A&M International University in Laredo, Texas. NHI undergraduate alumni act as coaches and work with the students through an accelerated learning process culminating in a three-day, highly intense competition.

What do participants take away?

Action learning principles guide the process of this program. Learning to organize and express thought is an important part of a person's ability to succeed. Whether in school, the business world, or everyday contact with others, these capacities are especially important to youth who plan to play active leadership roles in community life. The Great Debate makes critical thinking and analysis fun because students work with peers their age and training coaches, who are just two or three years older. There is a notable difference that a three-month training program makes on students' self-confidence and focus. Critical reading and thinking also become building blocks that improve college entrance examinations. Earning top grades and striving for excellence becomes normal.

How does the student qualify to participate?

An applicant must have a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale (unweighted) or higher and serious intent to attend college. High school counselor nominations always give an edge to applicants. A counselor can make nominations by calling our office. Applications must be submitted by the deadline indicated, along with a \$20 USD application processing fee at www.nhi-net.org. Applications lacking the \$20 fee are placed on "Inactive" status. Make sure to include the name of any NHI alumnus/a who assisted you.

If you participate in the four-day community based experience you will be immediately connected with the local volunteer training team and area Project Administrator, a certified adult volunteer who manages and guides the local Great Debate project.
